— WELCOME

Karen did not need another school. It needed *this one*.

Nairobi has excellent schools. It has fewer where a child is actually known: where the class is small enough that nobody drifts to the back and stays there, and the facilities are good enough that a child finds the one thing they are brilliant at early.

We inherited a campus built for many hundreds of children. Rather than fill it as fast as possible, we are opening it slowly, one small cohort at a time, and holding classes at twenty-five. That decision costs us money and buys your child attention. It is the whole argument for Elyton, and we would rather be judged on it than on adjectives.

— THE FOUNDING PROMISE

Six things we are choosing to be held to

A school that has not yet taught a single child has no results to quote and no alumni to celebrate. What we can offer instead is a set of commitments specific enough for you to check — on Open Day, in year one, and every year after.

01 No more than twenty-five per class, from the very first day.

A hard ceiling on every class, not an average that lets one group run larger while another runs small. Our first families get the smallest classes Elyton will ever run, and the most attention per child we will ever be able to give.

02 The teachers you meet are the teachers you get.

Our teaching team is appointed before we open, ahead of any enrolment target. On Open Day you meet the people who will actually take your child's class, and you can ask them where they have taught and what they believe about learning.

03 A campus built for many more children than we will admit.

A purpose-built campus in Karen: a 400-metre all-weather athletics track, playing fields, a library, a multipurpose hall with a stage, smart classrooms throughout — handed to a cohort small enough to actually use all of it.

04 The British National Curriculum, taught properly.

Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, delivered by specialist teachers, with your child's progress reported against national expectations from the very first term.

05 Ask us anything on 29 August.

Fees, staffing, timelines, what is ready and what is still being made ready. Our Head of School takes open questions from the floor with nothing off the table. A school worth choosing can survive hard questions.

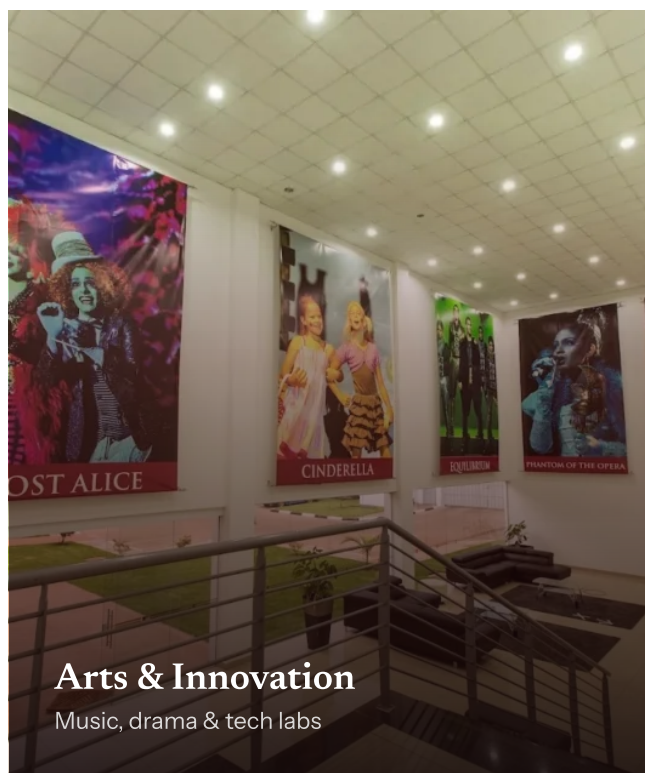

— ON CAMPUS

What is actually built, and ready

Every item below is on the Open Day walking route — not a rendering, not a plan. If it isn't finished, it isn't listed here.

A**Interactive smart classrooms**

Teaching spaces built for a class of twenty-five, with fitted display technology in every room.

B**School library & reading corner**

Quiet, well-stocked space built around the reading habit the British curriculum depends on.

C**400m all-weather athletics track**

A full track wrapping the main building, usable through both rainy seasons.

D**Playing fields & outdoor activity areas**

Open green ground for football, games and the simple business of running about.

E**Multipurpose hall**

A hall with a stage, so assemblies, drama and a school production are possible rather than aspirational.

F**Computing & digital learning**

Specialist computing provision supporting coding, robotics and digital literacy across the Key Stages.

G**Music & performing arts**

Instrumental tuition and performance, with piano lessons available as an optional activity.

H**Green grounds in Karen**

Open ground to run on, in the quiet of Karen.

I**Swimming pool**

Swimming taught on site from the first term, rather than bussed out to a hired lane across town.

ACADEMICS

The British National Curriculum, taught properly

Elyton teaches the full British National Curriculum, from the Early Years Foundation Stage through Key Stages 1 & 2. Every class is capped at twenty-five children, taught by specialist teachers appointed before admissions opened.

Attention is a matter of arithmetic before it is a matter of philosophy. Twenty-five is the number we chose.

AGES 3 TO 5

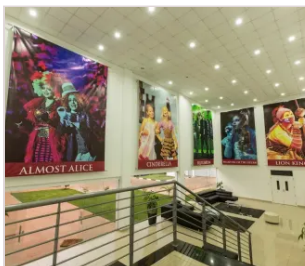
Play-based EYFS building the language, confidence and social footing that everything after it rests on.



Key Stage 1

YEARS 1 & 2 · AGES 5-7

Phonics, early mathematics and the reading habit, in classrooms of no more than twenty-five children.



Key Stage 2

YEARS 3 TO 6 · AGES 7-11

Specialist teaching in science, computing, languages and the arts, with progress reported against national expectations.

— STUDENT LIFE

Beyond the classroom

A founding cohort does not just join clubs — it starts them.

Ar**Arts**

Music, drama and visual art taught in studios and a stage, from Early Years through Key Stage 2.

At**Athletics**

A 400-metre all-weather track and an on-site pool — weekly PE for every year group, taught to the National Curriculum.

Cl**Student Leadership & Clubs**

A child brings an idea to their class teacher and can become its founding president — clubs the founding cohort starts, not joins.

Pm**After-school Program**

Supervised care from 3:30 to 5:30, Monday to Friday, with snack, homework time and a reading circle or elective.

Cm**Camps**

The campus does not close for the breaks — camps run on our own grounds through April, August and December.

— OUR PEOPLE

Experienced teachers, at a brand-new school

The single fairest question to ask any new school is: who exactly is going to teach my child? We would rather you asked our team that in person than read a paragraph about it. Every one of them will be on campus on 29 August.

1**Hired before we opened the list**

Our founding faculty were appointed ahead of admissions, not recruited to match whatever enrolment we achieved. The team is set before the first fee is paid.

2**British curriculum specialists**

EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 leads who have delivered this curriculum before, alongside specialist teachers for science, computing, music, art and sport.

3**Meet them, then decide**

At the Founding Open Day you can ask any teacher where they have taught, what they believe about learning, and how they will settle a room of new children in week one.

Twelve specialist teachers, appointed before a single fee was banked. All of them on campus for the Founding Open Day — **Saturday, 29 August 2026.**

PAYMENT TERMS

- 70% of tuition is remitted on or before the start of the new academic term.
- The remaining 30% is formally settled before the mid-term period.
- A 5% discount applies to the sibling of an Elyton pupil.
- Transport fees are based on your residential zone and are remitted in full.
- All payments are made to the institution's authorised bank accounts — connect with Elyton Admissions for the account details.

ADMISSIONS

Five steps to a founding place

Founding cohort places are limited by our cap of twenty-five per class. Here is exactly how a place is offered, in order.

1**Enquire**

Tell us your child's age and when you need a place. We reply with the founding fee schedule and the entry point your child would join, before any form.

2**Visit**

Come to the Founding Open Day on 29 August, or book a private weekday tour. Walk the campus and meet the teacher who would take your child's class.

3**Apply**

Complete the online application with your child's most recent school report. Founding cohort places are limited by our cap of twenty-five per class.

4**Meet your child**

A relaxed, age-appropriate session so we understand how your child learns and where they should start. It shapes their support plan, nothing more.

5**Join the founding cohort**

Accept your place, meet the other founding families, and help decide the things only a first cohort gets to decide, starting with our house names.
